

LEGISLATURE MEETING

December 21, 2016

Chairman Callard called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM. After the pledge to the flag and invocation, led by Veteran David Kusmierczak, the Clerk called the roll. All Legislators were present with the exception of Legislator Allport.

Legislator DeRoller presented a special recognition award to Michael Walsh from Oak Orchard on the Lake Neighbors who volunteered and worked diligently to clean out the vegetation on the jetties at Oak Orchard Harbour. Legislator DeRoller expressed how extremely grateful we are for Mr. Walsh's drive to secure the proper permits and collect \$1,000 in pledges from the Oak Orchard Neighborhood Association and St. Mary's Archer's Club to make this area beautiful again. Mr. Walsh stated that it started nearly three years ago when contacting the agencies to obtain the proper permits. He indicated that this is the first step and more work needs to be done in these jetties. Mr. Martilotta also expressed his appreciation to Mr. Walsh for the great work he has done to make our "point" beautiful again.

The Clerk presented the following communications: Susan Heard, Orleans County Treasurer, has forwarded a listing of Real Property Tax Refunds, in the amount of \$217.78, that has been reviewed and authorized by her office. The Orleans County Treasurer has provided the annual examination of Petty Cash Accounts report which has been filed in our office. Orleans County Economic Development Agency forwarded a thank you letter for supporting the access roads, sewer and water projects and development in general in Medina Business Park and across the County. ProAct – Pharmacy Benefit Management forwarded a letter updating us on our partnership with the Prescription Discount Card Program. Since our partnership began with ProAct program implementation in 2009, residents have saved over \$750,000. The Clerk of the Legislature Office continues to have available this discount cards upon request. Orleans County Chamber of Commerce, the Kendall Community Innovations Advisory Committee, the Kendall Lions Club and Kendall Leos Club; along with Kendall Student Drivers and students all forwarded letters or petitions to our office concerning a request for the Kendall High School Speed Limit reduction. Resolutions were also received from the Kendall Central School Board of Education and the Town of Kendall requesting the same.

The Treasurer distributed an Analysis of Monthly Cash Receipts and Disbursements through November, 2016. She wanted to remind the board when looking at the balance that they did the IGT the last couple days of November so the \$4.3 million will not appear until the December report is prepared and the money is received back. She encouraged everyone to shop locally for Christmas, even on line would help.

Chairman Callard called for open discussion as it related to the resolutions. Chairman Callard first called upon Legislator Johnson to inform the room about our dredging efforts. Legislator Johnson stated that Chairman Callard received a phone call advising us that we were awarded \$75,000 to create a dredging plan with other lake bordering counties. This will start the vehicle that will represent the counties for dredging so we can continue on in a coordinated effort and dredging will then be done on a continual basis. She expressed that this has been great news from the State that we were awarded this money. Chairman Callard stated that we have never had standardization of dredging in the county and we have gone fifteen years before we could do this. Our plan is to have standardization to where harbors could be dredged every five years and done on a rotational basis. Congressman Collins will be conducting a regional meeting with the lake counties here in Orleans County on January 4th and work will begin. He has assured us that there may be more funding to move this dredging project forward.

Jim Simon, Yates Town Supervisor, he expressed his appreciation to the Board for all of the support given to the Town of Yates, and Legislator Johnson, for the proposed project Apex Clean Energy Lighthouse Wind. He said in particular, he speaks in support of Resolution No. 475 and the debate of the Air Reserve Station is ongoing and at this time it is not closing. This particular resolution and what Congressman Collins is trying to

do will preclude any encroachment on this air base which is a beautiful asset that tomorrow could announce another aircraft is coming in to operate. So looking to the future, he asked for support of this resolution by this board.

Paul Lauricella, Yates, stated that he supports Resolution No. 475. He hopes that Congressman Collins, and hopefully the Trump administration will eliminate the tax credits and the funding for the biggest scam ever perpetuated on the American public in the idea of industrial wind or solar projects.

John Riggi, Town of Yates Councilman, shared commendation to the board in Resolution No. 475 and felt it was important to ensure that we are keeping encroachment from becoming a problem in the operations in the air. Another thing to keep in mind in considering this resolution is that this is on a national border, Canada and US, and we want to also ensure that our borders are secure due to the current political nature.

WHEREAS, the Department of Defense did announce in February 2016 that the Niagara Falls Air Reserve Station will be home to an Air Force Reserve KC-135 aerial refueling mission, and NFARS further is slated to be the home for command and control assets of an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Remote Split Operations Squadron, and

WHEREAS, the siting of wind turbines exceeding 600 feet in height could have a damaging effect on the ability of the Niagara Falls Air Reserve Station to take on either mission, and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Chris Collins, U.S. Representative for the 27th District, which includes the Niagara Falls Air Reserve Station, did introduce on November 29th of this year legislation, H.R. 6397, the Protection of Military Airfields from Wind Turbine Encroachment Act, and

WHEREAS, the Protection of Military Airfields from Wind Turbine Encroachment Act would make corporations owning wind turbine farms located within 40 miles of a military airfield ineligible for tax breaks for the same, and

Chairman Callard called for old business. Legislator DeRoller asked to comment on the correspondence that was received concerning the Kendall Jr/Sr High School speed reduction request. We should note that there are a lot of stakeholders participating in this request. As this board nows, 360 letters were submitted by the Kendall community. A letter was received from the Kendall Leo's club which is an offspring of the Kendall Lions club which consists of 60 members. He added that the Lions Club of Lyndonville has embraced the Leo's Club concept for their school allowing students to learn more and participate in public service. A letter was also received from the Kendall Community Innovation Advisory Committee, consisting of 15 members, which has been active nearly over a year now to oversee the quality of life in Kendall. A certified resolution has been received by both the Town of Kendall and from the Kendall Central School Board supporting the drive to get the speed limit reduced. The Orleans County Chamber of Commerce has also submitted their support along with signed petitions from current and potential student drivers at the Kendall Jr/Sr High School. Legislator DeRoller stated that many are driving forward to take a look at those speed zones on Route 18 in the school zone. Assemblyman Hawley has launched a plea for the Department of Transportation to do a study which has been recognized now and will take place. Sheriff Bower has acknowledged to him that the study is going on and Legislator DeRoller asked him to continue to keep an eye on this process for the best interest and safety for our youth. He shared his appreciation to the Board for the support of this initiative. Chairman Callard thanked him for his efforts.

Chairman Callard opened the floor for other comments and this time is not meant to debate an issue. Terry Williams, Carlton, who indicated he has been a hunter safety instructor for forty yeas with Mike Donahue and he does a lot of hunting with every weapon there is. He wanted to recommend, to help rifles be allowed to hunt, is to not allow semi automatic rifles for big game hunting in Orleans County. He said this would be a good safety factor for the people; also as well for the game, so they are not over shooting too much game. He said other than that, it would be a good safe process to have.

Chairman Callard asked if a sample resolution was submitted. Mr. Newton indicated the packet included a resolution. Chairman Callard asked if it addressed the use of semi automatic rifles. Mr. Newton said it does not and asked if his resolution only goes to this body. Chairman Callard indicated that it is only a recommendation.

Steve Colon, Yates, stated NYS does allow semi automatics for rifle hunting but they have a clip capacity of five.

Paul Lauricella, Yates, stated that he would support the use of rifles in Orleans County. He asked if there will be a two year review on this. Chairman Callard stated that we would make a recommendation to the Legislature, which he believes they did in Genesee County. A gentleman expressed that this is in place in every county in the state. Mr. Lauricella stated that a lot of farming land has been opened and rented out. He was wondering if the Legislature could suggest to the farming community, without creating another program or burden to the tax payer, if they can put some type of wind break in to help with local drifting. Chairman Callard stated that our Highway Superintendent is here today and has heard Mr. Lauricella's concern.

Bruce Schmidt, Gaines, thanked the County administration for this year's Veterans Service. He attended this year's service and commended Veterans Director Earl Schmidt for his great work. He said the Daughters of the

American Revolution provided the refreshments along with three Legislators, DeRoller, Allport and Johnson who spoke poignantly about our government, service, and our flag. He said Director Schmidt was able to present medals to a veteran's widow. The best thing is that Director Schmidt got Al Nixon a combat veteran of WWII and Korea, to speak, who after completing his service duty went on to another career of being a Lutheran Minister for fifteen years. He spoke poignantly of his fellowships that he obtained going through the various services, but did not speak of his service in combat which is typical of a service veteran. Mr. Schmidt said it was great to see the largest honor guard present and hear the program of this year's service. He shared his great appreciation of this day. Chairman Callard thanked Mr. Schmidt for his comments and agreed it was a great Veteran's Day service held in our County.

Mr. Newton asked if the documents he left in the Legislature packets were sufficient. If more information is needed to please advise him. He thanked the Board for having the Sportsmen Federation speak at this evening's board meeting. Chairman Callard thanked him for the details and now the board can begin their review process. Mr. Newton added that information that he provided to the Clerk may not all be included in their packets. Chairman Callard assured him that we will make sure all of the board members have a complete file.

Andrew Flemming, Clarendon, expressed that he supports rifle use for big game hunting. He indicated that he had sent e-mails to Legislator Eick supporting this effort. He was unaware of the efforts of the Federation of Sportsmen and he commended them for moving this forward, for he said he didn't know exactly how to spearhead this on his own, which was his intend to do so.

Paul Kroth, who resides in Carlton and is our local DEC Officer, said whether or not rifles are allowed for big game hunting in Orleans, it will be his job to enforce the wishes of this body. He said currently New York State allows rifles, shotguns, pistols, muzzleloaders, bow and arrow, and crossbows as the only legal implements to use to hunt big game. The only one in this area not allowed to use is a rifle. He said hunters still need to practice basic safety standards, such as identifying their target and knowing what is beyond it. He said if they miss or it goes straight through, they need to know where that round is going to go if it goes through their target. Some spots in Orleans are not appropriate for rifles, Kroth said, because roads and houses are too close by. DEC Officer Kroth said there are a lot of smaller blocks where a rifle would not be an appropriate implement to use, a hunter needs to know this. Hunters who use poor judgment and injure or even kill someone can face charges from reckless endangerment to manslaughter. DEC Officer Kroth stated that we are going to enforce the law no matter which way you decide.

Legislator DeFilipps moved to adjourn; second by Legislator DeRoller. Merry Christmas! Meeting adjourned at 5:17 p.m.
