

STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARATION

A State of Emergency is hereby declared in County of Orleans within the limits of the Towns of Yates, Carlton and Kendall effective at 1400 on June 20, 2017.

This State of Emergency has been declared due to preparedness measures being taken in anticipation of the Lake Ontario water level continually rising and becoming a long term hazard. Presently the water level continues to rise and there has been flooding impacting low lying areas based on wind direction and water levels. There is presently no immediate public safety threat, the situation will continually be monitored and orders will be executed based on the circumstances at the time of concern.

This situation could potentially threaten the public safety.

This State of Emergency will remain in effect until rescinded by a subsequent order.

As the Chief Executive of the County of Orleans, I, David B. Callard, exercise the authority given me under Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, to preserve the public safety and hereby render all required and available assistance vital to the security, well-being, and health of the citizens of this County.

I hereby direct all departments and agencies of the County of Orleans to take whatever steps are necessary to protect life and property, public infrastructure, and provide such emergency assistance deemed necessary.

EMERGENCY ORDER

Local Emergency Order for: County of Orleans:

I, David B. Callard, the Chief Executive of County of Orleans, in accordance with the declaration of a State of Emergency issued on June 20, 2017, and pursuant to Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, do hereby order that all boat traffic along the lake shores of Lake Ontario in the County of Orleans must operate at idle speed only causing no wake. This idle speed order extends out to a distance of 500 feet.

This order is for the safety of boaters and residents and residences along the shoreline.

This order shall take effect IMMEDIATELY and shall remain in effect until removed by order of the Chief Executive.

This order may also be renewed in (5) five-day increments.

Failure to obey this order is a criminal offense, punishable by law under New York State Executive Law § 24(5).


